Minor Injury/Illness

Minor injuries do not present a serious health risk and can be sufficiently treated by using standard first aid supplies and techniques, can be accomplished with self-help.

- Minor Cuts
- Scrapes
- Burns
- Bruises
- Sprains, etc.

Moderate Injury/Illness

Moderate injuries involve initial first aid treatment followed by a consultation with a medical professional. They often require that someone assist the injured to provide first aid and transport to a medical facility for additional follow-up.

- Third degree burns
- Deep cuts
- Bone fractures/breaks
- Overexposures to chemicals, etc.

Major injuries require immediate action to dispatch emergency responders.

- Symptoms of heart attack or stroke
- Profuse bleeding
- Amputations
- Unconsciousness
- Anaphylactic reaction
- Hypoglycemia in diabetics
- Shock
- Seizures, etc.
